





WHY DO WE WANT TO CLOSE READ THE BIBLE?

CLOSE READING HELPS YOUR INTERPRETATION

THE EXAMPLE OF CHRIST MATTHEW 5:21-48

21Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill shall be in danger of the judgment: 22But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca, shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire. 23Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee; 24Leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift

27Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not commit adultery: 28But I say unto you, That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart. 29And if thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell. 30And if thy right hand offend thee, cut it off, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell.


38Ye have heard that it hath been said, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth: 39But I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also. 40And if any man will sue thee at the law, and take away thy coat, let him have thy cloke also. 41And whosoever shall compel thee to go a mile, go with him twain. 42Give to him that asketh thee, and from him that would borrow of thee turn not thou away.

43Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy. 44But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you; 45That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust. 46For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye? do not even the publicans the same? 47And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more than others? do not even the publicans so?

THREE KEYS TO CLOSE READING THE BIBLE.

OBSERVATION OF THE TEXT

- Record what you read, highlight or take notes on what "hits" you.
- Read slowly, read the word as if you have never read it before, especially familiar passages.
- Pay attention to recurring words, ideas or examples.
- Look for calls for action. Every textual teaching has application benefits.



QUESTION THE TEXT

- Close reading of the scriptures should bring out some questions in your mind.
- Read what the text says, and consider what it doesn't say.
- Read with a built in question, why is this important to me?
- What is this text saying to me, and those whom I impact?



ANSWER WITH YOUR INTERPRETATION

- Review the text, and review your observations as many times as necessary.
- Does my understanding of this text now, reinforce or oppose my previous understanding?
- Summarize your conclusion.
- Simplify your conclusion.
- Support your conclusion.






TRANSLATION MEANS INTERPRETATION

- The Bible is written in three languages: Hebrew, Aramaic and Greek.
- Unless you speak and read those languages, and you can get a copy of the original manuscript of the Bible you are reading a translation.
- Translations require interpretation for understanding.
- John: 21:15-17




THE BIBLE SPEAKS TO WHERE YOU ARE

- Your circumstance and situation determines your understanding and application of Bible lessons.
- Your interpretation of scripture is influenced by your life experience.
 What you have endured either opens your eyes, or closes them.
- Every book in the Bible has a target audience, and a desired result.
- The bible is written to be interpreted and applied.




COMMUNITY READING

- More thoughts and opinions on the text helps us get a better understanding, or it can reinforce our own interpretations.
- Dialogue concerning controversial passages of scripture is fruitful.
 Debate can often reveal different perspectives.
- Hearing the word read to you can also unlock the imagination to see things we can't see when we read alone.



DEPTH OF INTERPRETATION

- Traditional Reading; what we have believed the scripture is saying.
- Intertextuality; is the comparison of scripture to either confirm or refute the point of emphasis of a passage.
- Authorial Agenda; Every Bible book was written for a purpose and to a specific audience.
- Translation choice; in close reading multiple translations are used for clarity and comprehension
